PLAN WILSON COMMUNITY WORKSHOPS ANNOUNCED

Wilson County, Tenn. --- Wilson County officials are pleased to announce a series of Community Workshops set for November as part of the ongoing Plan Wilson initiative. These workshops are an essential step in updating the county's master land use plan, and residents are invited to participate and contribute their vision for the future of the county.

Plan Wilson is a collaborative effort to engage the public in establishing priorities and shaping a comprehensive vision for Wilson County's future development. Through extensive community engagement over the past several months, six key themes have emerged: growth management, economic vitality, resilience and sustainability, rural preservation, responsive government, and infrastructure investment. These themes will serve as the foundation for further discussions at the workshops.

The workshops are designed to collect valuable input from residents on where and how they envision future growth and development in the county. While these sessions will not focus on current or specific projects, they provide an opportunity for participants to explore broader planning ideas and contribute to the county's future strategies in a meaningful way.

Each workshop will open at 5:30 p.m. with interactive exhibits, followed by a presentation and participatory activity beginning at 6:00 p.m.
